



**Town of Nags Head
Water Resources Development Grant Resolution**

WHEREAS, the Town of Nags Head Board of Commissioners desires to sponsor a Beach Restoration project for the planning, design, permitting and construction of beach quality sand placement along a ten-mile length of oceanfront in Nags Head, NC; and

WHEREAS, sand material will be hydraulically dredged from an off-shore borrow source, transported, and placed along the dry-sand beach in the project limits; and

WHEREAS, complementary erosion control measures in the form of sandfencing and vegetative sprigging will be installed along the existing dune complex to mitigate aeolian transport; and

WHEREAS, these efforts are intended to supplement the 4465DR-NC FEMA Category G, Post-Dorian Beach Restoration project; and

WHEREAS, these restorative efforts will aid in mitigating coastal storm damage to the Nags Head ocean beach and dune system from the threat of natural hazards and erosion, reducing the adverse impacts on wildlife, public infrastructure and private property, preserving Nags Head's beaches, and safeguarding the benefit that coastal tourism contributes to the State's economy; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

- 1) The Board requests the State of North Carolina to provide financial assistance to the Town of Nags Head for Town of Nags Head Beach Restoration project in the amount of \$1,408,247.19;
- 2) The Board assumes full obligation for payment of the balance of project costs;
- 3) The Board will obtain all necessary State and Federal permits;
- 4) The Board will comply with all applicable laws governing the award of contracts and the expenditure of public funds by local governments;
- 5) The Board will supervise construction of the project to assure compliance with permit conditions and to assure safe and proper construction according to approved plans and specifications;
- 6) The Board will obtain appropriate easements, rights-of-way or suitable dredge material disposal areas that may be necessary for the construction and operation of the project without cost or obligation to the State;
- 7) The Board will ensure that the project is open for use by the public on an equal basis with limited restrictions (if on public property);
- 8) The Board will hold the State harmless from any damages that may result from the construction, operation and maintenance of the project; and

- 9) The Board accepts responsibility for the operation and maintenance of the completed project.
